Discussion points:

- Office Supplies include HST and GST
- Could travel costs be cut in future? Face to face meetings are beneficial and productive due to the amount of work being done by the Board of Directors. Face to face meetings are also required due to logistical challenges of our board being spread out over multiple time zones and also intermittent internet connectivity problems can occur.
- Surplus funds CANNOT be used for provincial legislation as this is a provincial matter. A LOAN to provinces would be considered on a case-by-case basis by the CSCT Board of Directors.
- Can surplus funds be used for Covid relief i.e. no dues for a year. This should be discussed provincially and will also be added to the February 2022 Board of Directors meeting agenda.
- Would CSCT consider a buy-in Pension Plan this will be taken to the February 2022 Board of Directors Meeting

Discussion points:

- Is the CSCT NOCP due for a review? The previous accrediting body (CMA) required a 7-year review. The current accrediting body (Accreditation Canada) advises that a review is not needed at this time.
- The end of the current triennium is December 31, 2022
- CSCT is an educational partner with CCS
- CCC registration is for personal use only. However, if CCC On Demand is purchased as a group, each person can individually apply for CEUs (internet studies as per CEU standards)
- CSCT education day has always been part of CCC and as such has associated costs
- To access webinars associated with CCC CSCT members need to register for CCC OR CCC On Demand
- CEUs are determined by each provincial CEU Coordinator according to the CSCT CEU Standards NOT by management
- 5 credits for AGM attendance are AUTOMATICALLY added to each member's account.

Questions from the floor

- A suggestion was made to split the cost of dues 50/50 between the provinces and CSCT. Currently CSCT receives \$65 per member which is less than 50% of dues paid. A 50/50 split between the provinces and CSCT would mean the provinces would receive less money.
- Is there a representative from each province on the Bylaw Committee? The CSCT BOD is the Bylaw Committee therefore each province has a representative.
- Anyone can submit suggestions for the Bylaw review.
- CCC On Demand is available only after CCC is completed.
- Online webinar AGMs will be dictated by Covid-19. The preference is for face to face.
- Why was only one member nominated from each province for the Provincial Director positions. As per the Nomination Committee report "A call for nominations for eight Directors, one from each province, was emailed to each provincial board AND the membership on May 6, 2021. All the Director nominees on the proxy have been elected or appointed Provincial Director in their respective provinces. No other nominations were received".
- Communicating the provincial breakdown of the numbers of successful exam candidates will be discussed by the CSCT BOD.
