



NBSCT Director's Report September 2019

The Annual General Meeting of the New Brunswick Society of Cardiology Technologists was held in Saint John NB on September 26, 2019, with 36 voting members present, and 2 valid proxies submitted.

The NBSCT has been granted a seat on the Program Advisory Committee for CCNB, who administer and teach the Cardiology Technologist's program in New Brunswick. Although this course is offered in French to the students, the committee is comprised of both Francophone and Anglophone members. I will be sitting on the committee as a representative of the NBSCT. It is the first time that NB has had a seat at this table, a fact that is a great step for our profession.

Provincially, our bargaining union will be sending out a survey to the members of the Medical Science Professionals entitled "Joint Job Evaluation Survey". This survey will be utilized in the classifications within the union, depending on the job descriptions offered by the members. The NBSCT, as a provincial body, has agreed to attempt to complete the survey as a group to ensure that the province is aware of exactly what we do in our profession.

The members have spoken loud and clear regarding the CEU guidelines. They are all very much in favour of unified national standards, and wish to have greater clarity provided to them via the national body. As their results at the end of the triennium in NB could signal the inability of some members to work, this is something that our members feel very passionate about.

There was no election of officers, as this is not due until 2020. Our executive has remained the same.
